

HUDSON WAS THE FIRST BABY MOVED TO THE NEW NICU

OMNI BEDS

More than 1,400 babies like Hudson are cared for in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) each year. With your support, the new NICU, which opened in the new HSC Winnipeg Women's Hospital on December 1, 2019, is outfitted with the very best equipment available to care for the tiniest and most fragile babies in the province. Your generosity helped purchase state-of-the-art equipment like omnibeds (specialized beds required for critically ill newborns), cribs, milk warmers, radiant warmers, incubators, ventilators and more.

MRI GOGGLES

Nobody really enjoys undergoing an MRI. But these scans can be life-saving ... and lifealtering. For a child they can also be scary. It's hard to get them to lie still. You helped to purchase new Cinema Vision Goggles that come with headphones which shut out the loud MRI machine noise, allowing kids to watch a DVD of their choice while in the machine. Without goggles, scans are often incomplete due to claustrophobia and some kids have to be sedated due to anxiety, meaning longer recovery time after a scan.



As soon as Olivia was born, the team united to save her life. As well as her heart issue, her esophagus was unattached. She couldn't breathe. It was terrifying. I'll remember the hearts of people like you for all the care and support they give to these children that they don't even know. As a mother who almost lost her child, I am so thankful. -CRYSTAL. NEUROMICROSCOPE

Because you took the time to care, kids like 16-year-old Lillian will be seizure-free thanks to brain surgery using a new neuromicroscope. Children's Hospital became the first pediatric facility in Canada to have a Zeiss Kinevo 900 neuromicroscope, which provides 120-degree viewing, allowing surgeons to see unexplored areas of the brain while looking around corners. Within three days of her surgery, Lillian was able to go home and continue to play the piano, cheerlead and spend time with her friends.

VIDEO-ASSISTED LARYNGOSCOPES

As the province's trauma centre, the sickest and most critically injured kids come to Children's Hospital for care. Kids like Olivia. When you need to get a little one breathing, getting it right quickly is vitally important. Thanks to donors, staff in pediatric intensive care (PICU) and Children's Emergency now have video-assisted laryngoscopes that help them see the inside of a child's throat when they need to insert a breathing tube.

HELPING KIDS BE KIDS, ONE USED BOOK AT A TIME

For 59 years, the Children's Hospital Book Market has made miracles happen.

After two successful events in April and September 2019, they announced total fundraising of \$468,000. But the impact is far greater than anyone purchasing a two-dollar book could ever imagine.

With this donation to the Children's Hospital Foundation of Manitoba, the hospital:

- Replaced 70 old TVs in patient rooms
- Bought new books for the Book Corner and Family Information libraries
- Funded book bags for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit
- Purchased new DVDs and DVD players for the Book Corner Library
- Bought grief and trauma package supplies for patients and families
- Continued to fund CHTV (the Children's Hospital noncommercialized, closed-circuit television channel for patients) and the libraries

Established in 1961, the Book Market is the longest-running fundraiser in support of the Foundation. Since its inception, it has raised over \$9 million in support of child health care in Manitoba.

YOUR GIFTS AT WORK: HOSPITAL PROGRAMS

Being a kid in hospital is tough. That's why innovative programs like Child Life are so important. Using humour, music, art and play therapy, libraries and CHTV, Children's Hospital's very own TV station, Child Life specialists help kids like Wesley (and their families!) cope with uncertainty and grief.

THE GOOD DAY SHOW ON CHTV

The Good Day Show is a live and interactive show that airs weekdays on CHTV. Hosted by No Name, the hardest working sock puppet in Manitoba, the show welcomed more than 60 special guests in 2019.

YOUR GIFTS AT WORK: RESEARCH AND LEARNING



From allergies to concussions, rare genetic disorders to mental health, scientists at Children's Hospital Research Institute of Manitoba (CHRIM) are helping to understand childhood disease here and around the world. Key research areas of focus align with the health care needs of the community, including asthma and allergy, diabetes, emergency medicine, neurodevelopment and rehab, and developmental origins of health and chronic diseases in children. CHRIM is the research arm of the Foundation.



UNDERSTANDING TYPE 2 DIABETES



Thanks to your support, researchers like Taylor Morriseau are investigating type 2 diabetes, the fastest growing chronic illness in Canada. Manitoba has one of the highest rates of type 2 diabetes in children in the world. "Indigenous youth are disproportionately burdened by diseases like early-onset type 2 diabetes," she says. Taylor explores how nutrients abundant in traditional Indigenous foods may prevent or delay type 2 diabetes development. By incorporating Indigenous knowledge, Taylor strives to inform policies surrounding food security and the restoration of traditional food practices to end the cycle that perpetuates poor health generation to generation.

UNDERSTANDING ALLERGIES AND BREASTMILK

We all know now just how important breastfeeding is - for both mothers and babies. Dr. Meghan Azad is unlocking the true power of breastmilk with research that shows it may protect against infant obesity, allergies, asthma and more. Dr. Azad and her research team have found that peanut consumption during breastfeeding may in fact help protect babies from developing peanut allergies later in childhood. "What's interesting about this study is that it is the first to consider peanut exposure through breastfeeding together with direct exposure before 12 months old," says Dr. Azad. Approximately 7% of Canadian children have a food allergy, with peanut being the most common. Learning how to prevent allergies through maternal food choices during breastfeeding could be a major step in helping more children live allergy-free.





INNQVATORS UNDERSTANDING BABY TALK

Started three years ago under the direction of Foundation board member, Carmyn Aleshka, The Innovators is a unique and exclusive program for the next generation of philanthropists to explore innovative ideas that can help change the landscape of child health in Manitoba and beyond.

Similar to a scientific "Dragon's Den", at the end of the year, they meet and vote for the project they would like to support and fund it themselves collectively.

In 2019, Dr. Ayesha Saleem's project, "Understanding Baby Talk – Can We Decipher Fetal-Maternal Communication" was selected and awarded \$50,000 by The Innovators. Dr. Saleem researches genetic diseases and the role of extracellular vesicles, or EVs, the "cellular email system." EVs carry biological information and are released from all cells. The question: can EVs cross the placental barrier? If so, can diagnostic biomarkers using fetal EVs for hard-to-diagnose genetic diseases be developed?

A lot has changed in the 30 years since the pediatric cardiology clinic first opened. Kids with heart conditions are living longer, healthier lives than ever before. But many need ongoing medical care. Thirty years ago, 1,800 children were treated each year; now that number is 6,000!

That's why in 2018 a campaign was launched to raise \$3.5 million to build a brand-new Children's Heart Centre. Supporters like you have responded with enthusiasm and generosity, such that the campaign's scope grew to \$10.9 million in 2019, thanks to the passion of campaign champions Gerry and Barb Price.

In addition to building the new Children's Heart Centre, the campaign now includes a catheterization lab and fluoroscopy lab, and new specialized equipment. In 2020, the campaign goal will grow further to \$14.7 million to extend critically important vital signs remote monitoring capabilities across inpatient units in Children's Hospital. The clinic will open in spring 2021.

THANK YOU, GIANNA

Born early at 27 weeks old, weighing just over a pound, partially blind and experiencing congestive heart failure, Gianna Eusebio was rushed to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). Doctors saved her heart, but Gianna was then required to stay in hospital for seven months and have laser eye surgery as an infant. For the first two years of her life, Gianna had many specialists, including feeding, physio, speech and occupational therapy.

"It took a village of doctors and nurses around the clock to help get me better. I was in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, and graduated to other units after that," says Gianna.

In 2019, Gianna was chosen as Children's Hospital Foundation of Manitoba Champion Child and spent the year speaking on behalf of 130,000 other children who need HSC Winnipeg Children's Hospital each year. During her role, Gianna travelled to Florida to meet other child champions from Canada and the U.S. who represented their local children's hospital. She also shared her story at more than 40 events across Manitoba, inspiring many while showcasing what an amazing hospital and research institute we have here.

At the end of her year, Gianna presented \$14,000 in money she has raised to support the unit that saved her life as a baby. "Keep my story in your heart and ask others to open theirs to make many more miracles happen like me," says Gianna.

Extra Life is a peer-to-peer program through CMN and CCHF. Extra Life unites thousands of gamers to play games and heal kids by fundraising as they play. Since its inception, Extra Life has raised over \$70 Million USD for sick and injured kids.

ST. PAUL'S HIGH SCHOOL

The Maroon and White Society at St. Paul's High School, a student-led philanthropic group, heard about Cohen's efforts to raise money for a less-invasive ultrasound machine that would help kids with Crohn's and Colitis like him. "His story was so moving and it was a unanimous decision to support Cohen's cause," Maroon and White Society president Chris George said. The group launched a series of fundraisers, including hot dog lunches, floor hockey games and a casual dress for Cohen day (St. Paul's students wear uniforms). They were a big hit at the private high school, and alumni who heard about the cause also sent in private donations. The students exceeded their goal of \$30,000, raising \$33,000.
